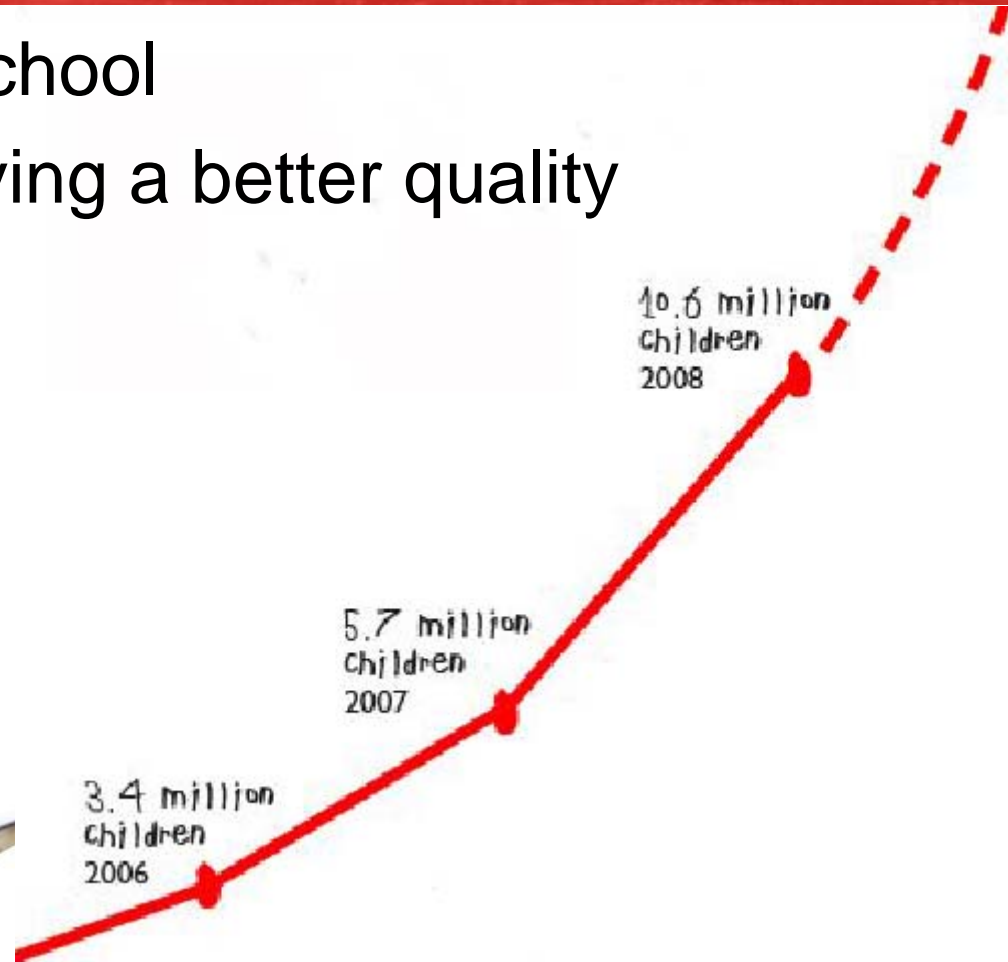


- Working in more than 20 conflict-affected countries

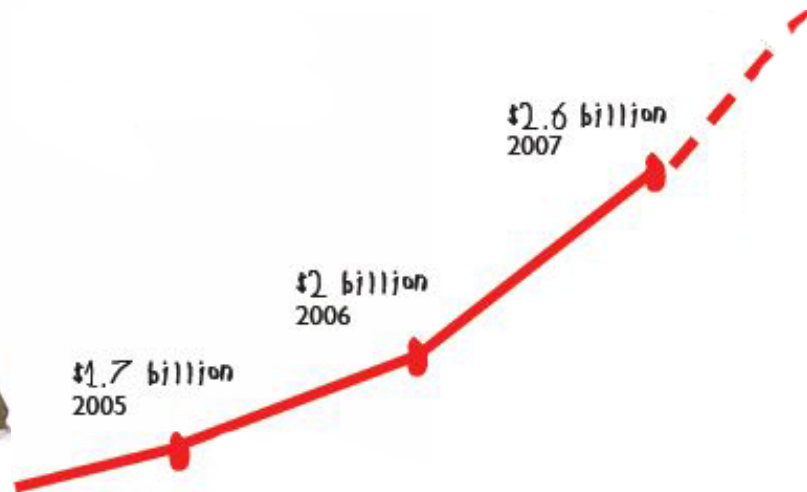

Global change for children

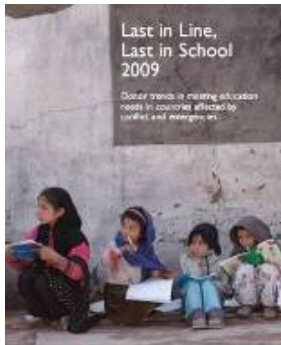
Our key international advocacy objectives:

Education and Peace


Save the Children raise the profile of the links between education and peace, and lay a roadmap for the inclusion of education as part of peace agreements.
